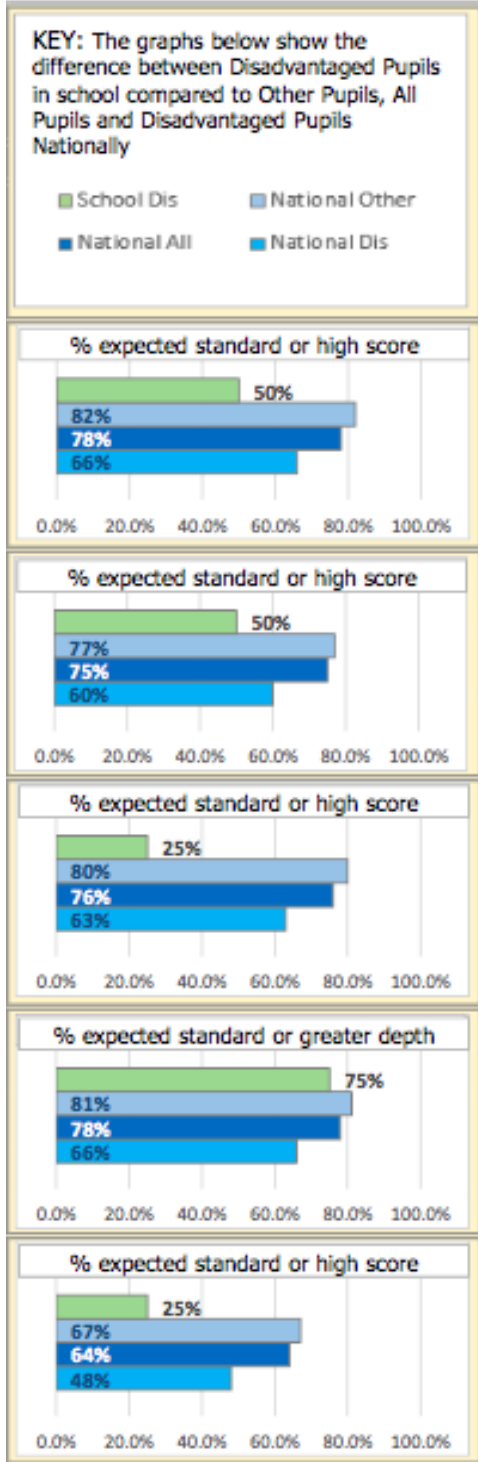

The categories and their percentages are: School Dis (67%), National Other (84%), National All (82%), and National Dis (70%).</p>
<p>Objective Two</p> <p>Improved progress for SEN and more able pupils KS2.</p>	<p>66% of SEN children made some progress in reading, writing and maths.</p> <p>Overall the middle prior achieving group are making progress and working in line with their year group expectations.</p>
<p>Objective Three</p> <p>Improved progress for high attaining pupils KS2.</p>	<p>More able pupils met the expected standard and GD at the end of KS2.</p>
<p>Objective Four</p> <p>To increase the low attendance or late arrival at school of 5 PP</p>	<p>The attendance has increased for 3 of the children.</p> <p>91.80% up to 94.12%</p> <p>95.50% up to 98.40%</p> <p>74.34% up to 87.43%</p>
