<i>Additional Teaching Assistants for Class support 1:1 and interventions throughout school</i>	£18,586	<i>Additional TA support has been allocated to work with pupils in receipt of PPG in years UEYFS, 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6.</i>	All children made good progress this year from intervention by teaching assistants. All Reception children in receipt of the Pupil Premium funding in Reception achieved a Good Level of Development.
		<i>Additional targeted support in the EYFS for pupil working below age-related expectation</i>	Increase the number of pupils who make rapid progress across EYFS so that there are a greater number of pupils who attain age-related expectations by end of EYFS through the focussed family group teaching method.
		<i>Additional targeted support in Key Stage 1 in phonics for children working below age-related expectations.</i>	One child in receipt of Pupil Premium funding didn't pass the Phonics Screening Test, but the child did receive intervention and has made good progress since Reception. All children in receipt of Pupil Premium funding in Year 2 who did not previously pass the Year 1 phonics check passed.
		<i>Additional targeted support each day for children working below age-related expectation in Key Stage Two.</i>	Pupils have made progress with their spelling in small, streamed groupings.
<i>Sound Training purchased to support Key Stage 2.</i>	£2844	<i>Additional targeted support in phonics once a week for children working below age-related expectation in Key Stage Two.</i>	Children in receipt of Pupil Premium funding in Year 5 and Year 6 increased their reading ages significantly. 100% of children in receipt of Pupil Premium funding in Year 6 achieved a high score in Reading and progress for these children was +7.93.
<i>Inspiring boys writing with Mike McGrother</i>	£1400	<i>To improve fine motor skills. To inspire ideas and engage boys to develop a real passion for writing.</i>	Mike helped six boys develop a real love for writing through one-to-one teaching. Their handwriting improved dramatically and they developed the ability to write for a sustained period of time.
<i>Monitoring of Pupil Premium Grant Spending half termly by Pupil Premium Co-ordinator.</i>	£600 (Release time)	<i>To regularly monitor the spending of PPG and ensure best value for money.</i>	Half termly reports were created stating summaries of actions and impact. Future priorities were identified as necessary and actioned.
<i>Year Five and Year Six subsidy of residential trips.</i>	£1000	<i>To enable pupils in receipt of PPG to widen their experiences and support the curriculum.</i>	One child in receipt of Pupil Premium went to Edinburgh and four children went to Winmarleigh. They experienced another city's history and culture or gained confidence and determination completing outdoor adventure activities.

<i>Maths for the more able children in receipt of PPG</i>	£325	<i>To challenge those children identified as G&T in Maths through problem solving. Lunch time Abacus sessions available to challenge children.</i>	100% of children in receipt of Pupil Premium funding in Year 6 achieved a high score in Mathematics and progress for these children was +7.73. More able children in other classes making good progress.
<i>English for the more able children in receipt of PPG</i>	£325	<i>To challenge those children identified as G&T in English through high quality challenging texts.</i>	100% of children in receipt of Pupil Premium funding in Year 6 achieved a high score in Reading and achieved greater depth in Writing. More able children in other classes making good progress.
